Topic: Aussie Legends

The Big Idea

A biography is a life story written about a person who has an interesting story or message to share. This could be a sports hero, inventor, scientist, entertainer, or an individual who has overcome a serious challenge in life.

Biographies usually have a big idea or important message that can help all of us in our lives. Learning about the life story of a successful person can teach essential life skills, such as:

- persevere to achieve goals
- maintain a fair perspective and recognise other viewpoints
- listen to learn from others
- learn to be independent without relying on the opinion of peers
- take personal responsibility and accountability for your choices and actions
- develop a love of learning
- deal with failure
- be kind, helpful, and considerate of others.

Learning from the real experiences of others is a great tool to help young people grow into successful, contributing members of society.

Background Knowledge

*the background knowledge and vocabulary required for all children to access and enjoy the story, activate prior knowledge but also provide knowledge for those who don't have any prior knowledge to activate

During the Story

leveled questioning framework as the story progresses - literal, inferential and evaluative questions After the story (Questions – CR, T&T)

leveled questioning framework for 'after the story' discussion. Eg. questions that pinpoint the main idea, moral, how it relates to their own experience

Explain that today we are going to read a biography. This biography is about Turia Pitt and tells how Turia shares her story to encourage others to be grateful for the things they have in their lives.

Turia Pitt's story also tells us that by taking small steps we can achieve what we want and be happy. We can choose to be brave and happy.

The focus words to access and enjoy the story are brave, encourage, and fundraise.

Turia Pitt liked to run until the day a bushfire stopped her. After 100 operations she had to learn to walk again, live again, and do everything for herself again.
